Sunny hopes that these books will bring a lot of joy and a smile to every child's face.

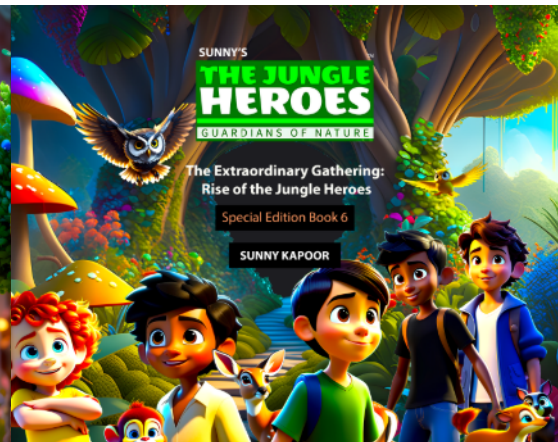
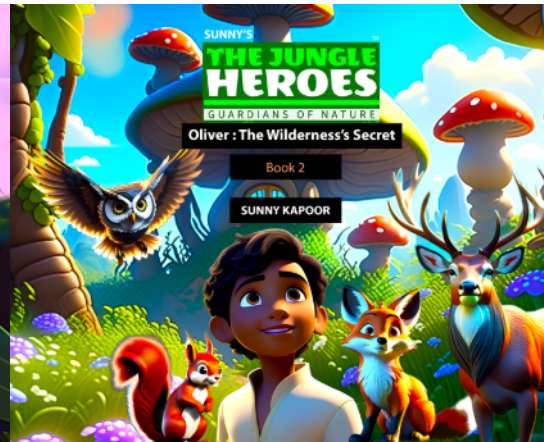

Words from the Author

What made me choose to start with animals and a jungle book instead of rebooting Yaksha Comics or other series first?

This is because I have a deep connection with animals from the very starting of my life. I had over thirteen generations of cats. I also had a pet parrot, who taught me the insatiable thirst for freedom, when it used to gnaw at the iron wires of the cage, trying to escape every day when no one was looking. One day he succeeded and flew away, probably got killed by the crows, but it taught me a valuable lesson - Freedom is priceless.

Today I find myself in a similar prison created by people, whom I have no connection with. Everyone kind of knows my story and these books are my insatiable attempt to break free of this prison.

I remembered an incident about twelve years ago when I visited the Kolkata Zoo. There was a huge open cage setup for Giraffe and one of the Giraffe, out of the blue, came towards me in the corner of the huge barricade, bending down asking for food. I asked people who were with me to break a branch and feed it.

It may have been a coincidence, but among hundreds of people, the giraffe approached me. Looking back, I realize that animals have an instinct for identifying who is generous, who can provide for them, and who poses no threat.

During my visit to Safari Zoo in Mauritius, I recall feeding a variety of animals, such as giraffes, goats, turtles, peacocks, and small petting zoo animals. I also gave pats to lions on their backs, cheetahs on their heads, as well as servals and other smaller wild cats. (check the pics in next section, I will try uploading the videos on website as well). My desire to be with animals would lead me, if I could escape this prison of the world's making.



Words from the Author (contd.)

I have been feeding pigeons every day for the last two years. Once they understood me as a 'giver' and someone who won't harm them, they started eating from my hands directly. I have trained them to listen to the whistle before food, so they will come flying when I whistle.

I have also realized that they talk telepathically with each other using vibrations. I understood it only when the alpha pigeon started sitting on my palms. The alpha will hit every other pigeon away and would try to eat solo from my hand. Often he will start fluttering, the whole body of the pigeon will start vibrating, signalling to other pigeons or to me, trying to see if I reciprocate or not.

When I try to talk with him mentally, he realizes he has no fear and keeps eating from my hand. If I do not reciprocate, he stares at me for a while. If no reply comes from me, scared, he flies away.

I also noticed that the pigeons send vibration signals to fly. Once the alpha sends the signals and flies, the entire flock will start flying in micro seconds following the alpha, not just one after the other, but all together. This cannot happen due to sense of motion but through some other vibration frequency which they can send and receive instantly.

We under estimate the value of life on this planet. We believe animals are way below us. That is why we torture them, use them for labor, hunt, kill and eat them. Only people who actually spend time with animals realize that how exceptional they are.

Obviously, they do not have a brain like us but they can still do amazing feats, which even we as humans cannot achieve.

We forget that we also have evolved from animals, and it has taken us billions of years to reach our evolution ladder. Animals have their own evolution ladder as well and thus we should really take care of them instead of killing, eating and poaching them. They are like our younger siblings.

The key to understanding the value of our lives and the lives of animals is to connect with nature and animals and abandon the technological jargon that confuses us. I hope my books will help children develop a deeper connection with animals and nature.

- Warning -

Although this book is for children, they must understand that they should never approach wild animals on their own. At the end, animals don't possess a brain like we do. Most of them are afraid of us. That is why they attack and not necessarily for hunting. It is only human beings who hunt for sport, animals seldom do it except the cat family. They kill for fun.

If you ever find yourself alone in the wild and confront a wild animal, then make your mind strong, remove any kind of fear or malice from your mind and send love signals towards the animal from your mind telepathically, and if running is not an option, try to stay absolutely still and smile at them. Actually, if you run, the runners like cats, dogs, bears and wolves will definitely chase you.

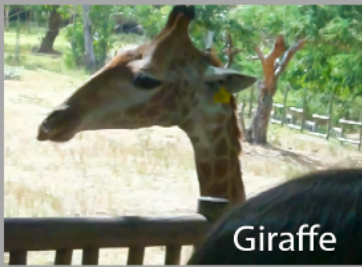
Even on streets never run from a street dog. Stay calm and composed and if they show teeth, tell them a stern no and then slowly walk away, keeping them in your eyesight in case they jump or attack.

Animals can sense fear in us. If we show gratitude or love towards them through our mind, they will leave you alone. If you stay still and they perceive no danger from you, they will just walk away. That includes all kinds of reptiles, even snakes. The pigeons come and sit on my hands because I stay absolutely still and make no sound at all. The moment I do any of these two things, they fly away.

Staying absolutely still makes your fluid mind to calm down and you can think and act better. The animal kingdom appreciates that stillness. If they comprehend that you're not a threat by being motionless, they'll either begin following you from afar (in-case you give them treats to eat) or disregard you and depart.

We do not realize how precious life on this planet is. There is no yet identified life in this solar system, and if there is life around other stars, they probably cannot come to us by crossing millions of light years' distance in space. We should really be grateful for the ecosystem we have on this planet and appreciate the animals who have their own roles in this ecosystem.
